NOTICE TO INVENTORS

The attention of applicants for patents is drawn to the desirability of avoiding publication of inventions in cases where the invention relates to Munitions of War as defined in the Official Secrets Acts, 1911 and 1920.

In such cases, after lodging an application at the Patent Office and thus obtaining protection, the inventor is advised to submit the details of his invention confidentially to the departments concerned, i.e., Admiralty, Ministry of Supply, Air Ministry, or Ministry of Aircraft Production, in good time before publication takes place, in order that, if considered necessary by such departments, steps may be taken for the invention and any patent to be granted thereon, to be kept secret.
